Super Summer Adventures is a multi-week summer learning and enrichment program. Our goal for the enrichment program is to create an informal, hands-on atmosphere that encourages creative learning and exploration for students entering Kindergarten through 6th grade.

We are seeking a Camp Director. The position will run July 11th through August 12th. Classes are five days a week, 9:00 to 3:30. This position will start a few days before camp to support onboarding of camp instructors and staff training and the director will need to be present before and after the camp day.

Duties:

- Commitment to supporting the well-being of teaching staff by consistently helping with difficult student behaviors and providing other support as needed.
- Creating an engaging welcome letter and weekly newsletters.
- Scheduling of lunches, breaks, and transitions. Monitor and assist with student lunch.
- Prepare morning and afternoon check in and announcements.
- Review teacher unit plans
- Oversee and participate in logistics of location set-up, tear-down and product inventory/assessment ability to lift 50 lbs.
- Plan and execute an organized check-in each session
- Work with families to address and resolve any concerns
- Help plan, organize, and participate in indoor and outdoor activities for students; ensure all
 activities are appropriate, fun, and adequately supervised
- Maintain positive staff and student morale
- Additional duties as needed and assigned by the Curator of Education
- Ensure that Instructors and students are meeting unit goals
- Apply behavior management techniques to enforce rules and safety regulations
- Ensure Instructors are on track for project completion and Friday student presentations
- Create and implement work schedules, roles and responsibilities for staff
- Hold routine meetings to address and resolve staff concerns
- Act as an emergency substitute for sick/absent Instructor
- Be continuously available to staff and students while on duty
- Escort students to and from lunch.

Health, Safety, & First-Aid:

- Ensure a safe environment is maintained at all times for students and staff
- Ensure proper supervision is occurring at all times, including but not limited to: upholding ratios, conducting head counts, and managing risk and student behavior during activities and outings
- Execute an organized camper allergy and medication check-in and check-out each session and provide accurate rosters with pertinent health information for each teacher.
- Respond to and document critical incidents.
- Required certifications include: Responding to Emergencies First Aid and CPR, will be provided by the Wenatchee Valley Museum if you don't have a current certificate.

Minimum Qualifications:

The ideal candidate has a playful team spirit and works well with minimal supervision but asks for assistance when needed. A minimum of 5 years previous K-12 teaching experience is required. Camp Directors must demonstrate impeccable judgment, strong organizational skills, and be able to communicate effectively via email, cell phone, and hand-written documents. The ideal candidate will demonstrate proficiency supporting the learning of diverse populations and has a strong commitment to sharing an appreciation for culture and nature. A commitment to maintaining a friendship between the museum and camp families is a top priority and PBIS training is preferred as well as the ability to navigate behavior contract protocol including conferencing with parents. You must also:

- Be able to pass WA background checks
- Due to the nature and responsibilities of this role, candidates hired will need to be fully vaccinated for COVID-19 by their first day of work.

Salary:

The Camp Director will be a contract (no benefits or income tax withheld) position. The position will be contracted at \$1,000 a week during the duration of camp. Additional contracted time may be included for pre-camp work depending on negotiations between the successful candidate and the Curator of Education.
